Historic Charm



Annual Town Events

<u>Kaleidoscope Festival:</u> Annual event in May celebrating the diversity and history of Waxhaw.

<u>Jammin' by the Tracks:</u> A bi-weekly summer concert series located in the heart of Downtown Waxhaw.

<u>Fourth of July Parade:</u> This long-standing tradition weaves through historic Downtown Waxhaw and is the community's kick-off to their Fourth of July holiday.

<u>Autumn Treasures:</u> Waxhaw's Fall Festival that includes a BBQ festival, carnival, food trucks, and craft vendors.

<u>Fright Night:</u> This yearly Halloween event features a haunted maze and trick-or-treating at our downtown businesses.

<u>Holiday Festival of Lights:</u> Waxhaw officially lights the town for the holidays the first weekend of December and hosts craft and gift vendors.

<u>Christmas Parade:</u> The second parade of the year celebrates the holiday season with floats around lights in Downtown Waxhaw.

Federal Requirements

- Federal Tax ID Registration
- Self-employment tax
- Quarterly filings

State Requirements

- North Carolina Sales Tax
- Alcohol and Beverage Control Licensing

Step 3: Contact the Town of Waxhaw to Meet Local Requirements

Your next step is to give us a call! We'll help you work through any permits and licensing you'll need locally. Below is a general step-by-step process to complete before you open!

- 1. Contact the Planning Department, 704-843-2195 We'll help you determine if your proposed business is allowed "by-right" or requires further action.
- 2. Apply for a Zoning Use Permit
 This will give your business type permission to operate in your specific location and zoning district.

- 3. Apply for <u>Building Permits</u>
 During construction, there are multiple inspections required. Most of these are detailed on your Building Permit and the applicable inspector must initial the permit.

- 4. If necessary, complete your Fire Prevention Inspection

- 5. You may need additional approvals from outside agencies:

- 6. Apply for a Sign Permit

- 7. Receive your Certificate of Occupancy After work is completed, a Certificate of Completion or Certificate of Occupancy can be requested. A CO will be issued when all of the departments determine your business meets standards and/or regulations established.
